PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT



JABC TechWorks 2022-23

For the first time ever, JABC TechWorks was offered both virtually and in person this school year. After two years of online-only deliveries, this work-readiness program was delivered to 400 students in Surrey in February. While introducing students to booming tech-related careers in B.C., this hands-on learning experience also fostered social interaction and encouraged personal development in a collaborative setting.





This capstone program prepares young people for the future of work. Through interactive presentations and discussions, youth are introduced to technologyrelated careers and the skills required as they prepare to enter the workforce.



Over 4,700 students were reached through the in-person and two virtual JABC Techworks deliveries.
