DISCOVER YOUR PITCH OVERVIEW



DISCOVER YOUR PITCH GIVES STUDENTS THE EXPERIENCE OF A LIFETIME

JABC was delighted to host the fifth annual Discovery Foundation's Discover your Pitch competition in Spring 2023.

Discover your Pitch (DYP) is an exclusive investor pitch competition for B.C. high school students to take their business presentation skills and knowledge to the next level. Upon successful completion of JA Be Entrepreneurial or JA Company Program, students were invited to refine their business ideas by participating in this six week program that included pitch foundation workshops and practice sessions.

JABC hosted an in-person finale where the finalists pitched to a panel of seasoned business leaders and entrepreneurs. A total of \$6,600 in cash prizes was handed out over the course of the program.

PITCH PRACTICE WITH SFU BUSINESS STUDENTS

Student teams met 1:1 with volunteers from SFU Beedie School of Business to receive constructive feedback and tailored advice on their pitches, presentation format, and communication abilities.

PRELIMINARY COMPETITION

In this learning opportunity, students presented their compelling pitches in front of a panel of judges and received direct feedback from the judges on how to refine their pitches and presentation skills.

38 students participated in the preliminary competition.

The top three teams received cash prizes.

FINAL COMPETITION

The top eight teams advanced to the finals.

On May 10, 2023, eight teams from the Lower Mainland region pitched live to a panel of seasoned business leaders at the Terminal City Club in downtown Vancouver. Parents, mentors, JABC team members and JABC partners came out to watch the pitches and meet the students. The event was co-hosted by JA Alumni, Sofia Sirianni and Nicole Manhas, who also happened to be past participants of DYP.

All of the teams were outstanding and demonstrated significant growth from when they started their DYP journeys.

Judge Joel Hansen said, "It was such a pleasure to hear pitches from this inspiring group of high school founders. The future of our province is in great hands."



TOTAL NUMBER OF STUDENTS WHO HAVE PARTICIPATED IN DYP SINCE ITS LAUNCH IN 2019:


STUDENT GROWTH COMPARISON FROM 2022:
