Now in its fourth year, JA British Columbia proudly continued its World of Choices program, engaging over 24,500 students in grades 6–12. This initiative offers a monthly series of virtual sessions featuring guest speakers from a wide range of industries and high-opportunity career fields across B.C.

World of Choices is designed to support students in exploring and refining their career goals by encouraging them to reflect on their interests and strengths, and discover how these align with emerging career paths. Participants gain confidence and practical insight to help them navigate an ever-evolving job market.

JA volunteers from local communities and businesses play a key role in the program, sharing their stories and experiences as guest speakers. These role models help students envision the possibilities available within their own communities and beyond.
